## History Festival 2016







The History Festival has established its place on South Australia's calendar. The Festival began as a week-long event in 2004 and immediately struck a chord with the community. It resonated and the festival was extended to a month to include the many events that communities wanted to produce. Last year more than 120,000 people took part in the History Festival at 523 events produced by 328 organisers across South Australia. This year it is bigger again. It is the largest history event in Australia and one of our largest community-based festivals.

History is about belonging and place. Each place has its own stories – its own sense of itself. Our state is especially diverse, from inner Adelaide, to the edge of the desert; from pre-settlement to yesterday, we are inspired by many different stories.

Our state has a distinctive history. South Australia was the only Australian colony founded as a planned, freesettled society. In the 19th century South Australia was a leader in democracy: the first colony to introduce full suffrage for men and the first to grant women the right to vote. In the 1970s South Australia was the first to introduce a sex discrimination act and was a leader in the arts. Our state is well known as a food and wine destination, and the history of agriculture and industry have helped to shape who we are. So too have our dramatic landscapes - from the outback deserts to the varied coastal forms and everything in between, South Australia has unique stories to tell.

South Australia's History Festival helps to record and share those stories in communities and beyond those communities with the world. I'm sure you will find something in the program that you can connect to.
