


Past Present Wonder

It is impossible to tell every story. However, when considering how to portray the theme of Wonder we matched some significant objects from collections with people to juxtapose the tangible with the emotional, all of which elicit a sense of wonder.

We trekked to the famous Alberton Oval to see how far women's sport has come in 100 years. We visited the South Australian Aviation Museum to capture the childlike fascination of air travel. We took a ride in a micro sports car that sold fewer than 50 vehicles in the 1960s. Through a pair of well-travelled ski boots, we experienced a refugee family's journey to Australia; and we gained insight into the contemporary collecting of history through one of the largest Kylie Minogue collections in the world.

These stories and images can be found on five unique front covers of the 2023 South Australia's History Festival program. Which of these is on your cover?

Isla Hansen Aero 145

South Australian Aviation Museum, ACR4304C

Isla is three and loves planes. The Aero 145 was built in 1961 and was imported to Australia from Czechoslovakia in 1962. It was part of Commodore Aviation Pty Ltd that was set up by John and Rosemary Doudy to carry out fish spotting in Port Lincoln.

The aircraft would fly over Kangaroo Island and out to the Great Australian Bight staying aloft for up to ten hours at a time. Over the next few years catches increased in what were the great years for fishing.




Nelya Valamanesh Kylie Minogue Collection

South Australian artist Troy-Anthony Baylis is a self-identified 'KylieMinologist', who has been collecting Kylie Minogue paraphernalia since he was 11.

Baylis is not just a music fan, but a chronicler of culture: "I adore Kylie and what she puts out into the world. Collating culture and creating culture are a safe space to carry out my archival tendencies."

Pictured is local film-maker, DJ and fellow Kylie-lover Nelya Valamanesh, who was delighted to trawl through this astonishing archive.







Alex Ballard 1911 Port Adelaide Lady's Ticket

State History Collection, HT 1991.0303

Port Adelaide Football Club entered the national AFLW competition in 2022 with a famous Port name leading the club, Erin Phillips.

Founded in 1870, the club's rich legacy continues with their AFLW squad under the guidance of Erin, coach Lauren Arnell and Head of Football Juliet Haslam.

One of Port's inaugural AFLW players is Alex Ballard, pictured at Alberton with a Lady's Ticket from Port Adelaide's 1911 SANFL season.

"This ticket reminds me of how humbling it is to pull on a Port Adelaide jumper: this is a club that has so much success and to now create our own history is something I'll never take for granted," Alex says.

Peter Wong 1965 Lightburn Zeta Sports

State History Collection, HT 2001.0413

In 1963, SA whitegoods company Lightburn & Co, pivoted from producing cement mixers, fibreglass boats and washing machines, to make automobiles.

Harold Lightburn's vision was to manufacture an affordable and practical car with efficient fuel economy. To ensure the sports model was strong, doors were not included.

Failing to capture Australian hearts, it is believed that only 48 of the sports-model were sold, yet South Australian Peter Wong (pictured) remembers it well: "When I first arrived here in 1970, Lightburn was still around... a remarkable South Australian project."

Franziska Lucas Childhood Boots

State History Collection, HT 1999.0066

These are well-travelled boots with a story to tell, originally belonging to Maria (Marilie) Wenzel and brought to Australia in the single trunk allowed per household, when the Walla family – Franziska, Marilie, Rainer and Werner – migrated from Austria in 1955.

Originally affixed to skis which were left behind, the donor's father Wenzel Walla was the one to add steel caps to the toes, giving the boots yet another life.

"They came out with us – my mother was particularly protective of them as they were very expensive at the time," says Franziska.

Adelaide's Heritage-listed Tram Barn: Home to the State Herbarium

The heritage-listed Tram Barn A was once part of a sprawling complex which housed the original fleet of Adelaide trams. 



In 1834 a group of men petitioned the Grand Lodge of England for a new lodge in what was to become South Australia. This new lodge met in London before the ships set sail. These new settlers first met in the Assembly Rooms, Black's Port Lincoln Hotel, Franklin Street, on the 11th of August 1838.

In the early 1880s, the colony Freemasons decided they could choose their rulers and manage their affairs. The Grand Lodge of South Australia was established on the 16th of April 1884 and held its inaugural meeting the following day in the Adelaide Town Hall.

In 1889 William Henry Gray donated land to create a place for the elderly. Masonic Homes provided dignity in retirement for Masons and their families decades before Governments offered social services.

October 1922, members spent £10,640 to acquire land for a Grand Lodge of South Australia. In April 1925, we laid the Foundation Stone of the new Freemasons building, and in April 1927, we completed the construction. The total cost of the land, buildings and furnishings was £116,318.


Freemason's Hall is still the headquarters of the Grand Lodge of South Australia and the Northern Territory. Today the Freemasons maintain Masonic Charities and Freemasons Foundation, which, from 2019 to 2022, has donated \$9,513,410, building on decades of giving and charitable work.

In 2020, faced with the risk of losing the Hall due to mounting maintenance costs and dwindling savings outside of the charities, the Board commenced a project to investigate ways to retain, sell or develop the site. In 2021, 86% of members voted for development subject to the protection of the essential elements of the front tower.

Today, the Freemasons of South Australia and the Northern Territory, with the encouragement of Grand Lodges around Australia, propose an iconic \$300 million construction that retains and restores the entirety of the front tower and delivers a public observation platform and worldclass hotel. We have established the Freemasons History and Literary Trust, to preserve and present artefacts and stories of their members, and have proudly partnered with the History Trust to celebrate the History Festival and strongly advocate for the proposed creation of AMoSAH - The Adelaide Museum of South Australia's History.

Freemasons have been with South Australia since the naming of the province. Through truth, benevolence, and fraternity, we hope to inspire others to invest in the future of our State with the benefit of a solid foundational knowledge of South Australia's great history.

Have you ever wondered what it means to be an Aussie?

In 2017 former Australian Prime Minister, Malcolm Turnbull, wrote:

"Australia is an immigrant nation. Almost half of our current population was either born overseas or has at least one parent born overseas"

Not to mention that in the context of Australia's deep past, the vast majority of Australians are descended from recent migrants. First Nations people of course have a particular connection to Australia and of all cultural groups it might be most appropriate to claim that they are not migrants. The reality though is not so simple.

Since 1986 the History Trust's Migration Museum has celebrated South Australia's cultural diversity, providing a platform for our newest Australians to share their stories alongside the broader narrative of nearly 200 years of colonisation. While developing the exhibition 'Aussies!' the Trust's curatorial team debated the merits of the label migrant; who is a migrant and at what point does the label cease to apply? The conversation soon turned to the notion of when do migrants feel like, and when are they accepted, as Aussies?

I don't have to search far for examples of how migrant identity is intertwined with being an Aussie. My wife

has Asian and Anglo heritage: her father migrated from Singapore in the 1960s. Physically, our children do not appear Asian, however they vociferously declare their 'Asianess', citing family meals and rituals brought from Singapore and adapted within the new setting. Meanwhile, my youngest daughter happily practices highland dancing, much to the bemusement of my father, himself a British migrant who seems to have little interest in his mostly Scottish ancestry. Put all of this together and we all (including their migrant grandparents) identify as Australian.

While the term Aussies sometimes conjures up images of bogans and other stereotypes – the 'Aussies!' exhibition celebrates difference and belonging, by reclaiming the term for all Australians, regardless of where they are from or what they look like.

Our story is not unique, its relationship to migration, cultural diversity and the palimpsest of modern Australian identities lies at the heart of what it means to be part of a multicultural society.

With our focus on history and heritage, the Trust has, through its Museums and Collections (MaC) program, grant funds and other community programs, a long and strong relationship with the South Australian History Network. Many curators make light work!

Ultimately, the historical collections of river communities were saved from the floods by the dedication and hard work of the many museum workers and community volunteers who stepped up to the enormous challenge of the rising river. An amazing effort all round that is preserving significant collections for the future!
